Hands

 w/ Construction

Paper

- colours your choice
- decorate in your design
- your choice for written messages on the fingers.

Step 2:

Poppy Parts

- Draw
- Cut-Out
- 8 to 16 poppies
- red construction paper
- 16 to 24 poppies
- red tissue paper
- your choice for sizes & shapes of poppies.

Step 3:

Poppy Centre

- Draw
- Cut-Out
- 4 to 8 poppy centres in black construction paper
- various sizes to your desire & design.

Step 4:

Making Poppies

- Decorate
- Glue
- Poppy Paper pieces together
- Use construction paper as base
- two tissue paper pieces on top of base
- complete with poppy centre piece

Step 5:

Wreath Design

- Place
- Glue
- Paper Poppies onto paper plate to create your desire design

Step 6:

Share Love

- November 11, 2020








Find | Differences Kids Logic Game

An Interview with a Soldier

Meet Ashton! He is a Master Corporal in the Canadian Armed Forces and a friend of the Concerned Kids.

1. What do you do in the Canadian Armed Forces?

I am a Mobile Support Equipment Operator. That means I'm a truck driver to help supply others to help us succeed in any mission. I sometimes use special equipment like mobile gas stations! I also teach and train new soldiers when they join the military.

2. Where do you work? Do you live on a base?

I work at a reserve base in Hamilton, but I live in my own house! Being a reservist, I don't need to live on or within any distance of a base.

3. What made you want to join the military? Why did you choose the army?

I joined the army because I wanted to be a part of an organization that can support my community and country when it is in need. I have always wanted to join the military but had other goals I wanted to accomplish outside of the military, so becoming a reservist helped me do both!

4. What are some of the things you do when you are at work?

When I work I practice skills with other members of my team like maintain trucks, practicing tactically resupplying units and teaching new recruits skills to be successful soldiers. Sometimes when there are natural disasters or public emergencies, I can be asked to help with disaster relief like floods or to respond to COVID-19.



DID YOU KNOW?

HII I'M ASHTON

The Canadian Armed Forces (or 'CAF' for short) are made up of men and women who serve in the Canadian Army, the Royal Canadian Navy, and the Royal Canadian Air Force. All three groups work together as one team to support Canada.

Members of the Army are called Soldiers.

Ashton and his friend are Soldiers.

5. What is your favorite part of your job?

My favorite part of my job is getting to mentor and teach new generations of soldiers as they enter the military. I find it is really rewarding helping as they go through the basic military qualification courses and shape them into effective soldiers.

6. How would you describe the importance of Remembrance Day?

I feel that Remembrance Day is so important because there are so many others who have risked and lost their lives for the freedoms and privileges that we take for granted every other day. There are some places in the world where it isn't safe for people to go to school, and others are judged for things that are accepted and welcomed here in Canada. When we realize how blessed and lucky we are to enjoy everything we do, it is easy to forget the price others have paid to be where we are today.



Anzac Day

Australian Remembrance Day, called Anzac Day, takes place on April 25th. Like in Canada, the United Kingdom, and many other countries, the poppy is a national symbol of remembrance and is worn to honor those that have fought for their country.

FALL VIRTUAL AFTER SCHOOL CLUB

Building on TCK's very successful Virtual Backyard Camp, TCK's After School Club offers children 7-12 years old with 4-week or 8-week virtual workshops. Our program that starts at 4:00 PM and run to 5:30 PM, engages our young audience while giving parents a much-needed break.

Our programs are designed to combat feelings of loneliness and isolation, and encourage positive thinking, goal setting, positive friendship skills, communication skills and empathy. Weekly, facilitators will lead fun art-based activities while exploring social themes youth face on a daily basis.

Every session will begin with a sing-a-long/ movement exercise to warm-up the group followed by a performance by one of our puppet characters. Our puppets will lead in a sharing circle with the group. The virtual club concludes with a facilitated art-based activity.


